he Maharashtra government appointed 1988 batch Indian Police Service (IPS) officer Rashmi Shukla as Director General of Police.

Important Point

- She has become the first woman police officer to hold the top police post in the state.
- This 1988 batch IPS officer had earlier worked in Sashastra Seema Bal on central deputation.
- She will take over the seat of 53-yearold Rajneesh Seth, who retired as DGP on December 31, 2023.
